Here is the Holiday Spice Wassail Recipe some of you asked about.

Serves 12 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon 6 cups Simply 100% Apple juice 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg 4 cups Simply Orange juice 1 teaspoon whole cloves 2 cups pineapple juice not from concentrate 3 cinnamon sticks

Slow cooker: mix all ingredients into slow cooker, except for fresh fruit. Heat on low for 6 hours or high for 3 hours. Add fresh fruit slices before serving. These are for decoration and do not add to the flavor so are completely optional. Skim cloves off the wassail before serving. Remove cinnamon sticks.

Stove top: Mix all ingredients and heat in a large stockpot. Bring to boil and simmer for 30 minutes. Add fresh fruit before serving
