### ***Message from the Board, Pete Gulliver, President***

Having received no requests for changes in the proposed 2012 budget at either the November Community meeting, the November Board meeting, or the December Board meeting, the directors approved the 2012 operating budget at the December Board meeting. Our 2012 POA dues are \$220.00 per property. A well deserved “THANK YOU” to our finance committee for their countless hours of hard work.

Our 2011 Holiday Party was a complete success. About 300 neighbors gathered to share good cheer, good company and good food. None of this would have been possible without the Recreation Committee members who volunteered their time before, during and after the afternoon of the party so that the rest of us could enjoy the time with our friends and loved ones.

Board members have received reports of people and cars gathering in our recreation area parking lot at unusual hours. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I spoke with the folks at the Sheriff’s substation about this and was asked to share the following advice: **If you see suspicious activity - CALL 9-1-1. If you are concerned about the people in the parking lot being able to figure out who made the call, you can request that the patrol car NOT come to your house.** Calling the POA office the next day, calling one of the board members, sending the office or a board member an e-mail does not help, **calling 9-1-1 helps.**

Our landscaper tells us that we are accumulating an amazing amount of leaves in the buffer zones between the gate homes and Country Club Drive. He is perplexed because many of the leaves are from hardwoods, but most of the trees in the buffer zones are soft woods. He is concerned that some other landscapers might be dumping leaves and yard waste in our buffer zones. Please be observant and let the office know if you see any suspicious activity. Unfortunately, our landscaper must pass along the additional labor costs associated with the cleanup and the additional cartage fees associated with the trips to the landfill to us – the POA members.

We have had yet another postponement concerning the foreclosure of the Carolina Shores Golf and Country Club, LLC. The new date is January 6, 2012.

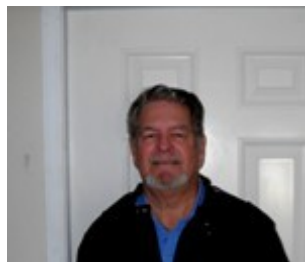
