Message from the Board, Pete Gulliver, President

On January 12 **Bob Jones and Mike Riccitelli** introduced First Sergeant Tom Tolley of the Brunswick County Sheriff's Department, who spoke with almost 50 residents about the various ways we can make our homes and ourselves less inviting to would be robbers, burglars, scam artists and muggers. First Sgt. Tolley discussed home burglar alarm systems, keeping the bushes and shrubs around our homes pruned in order to minimize hiding places for potential robbers and where to keep your pocketbook when you are food shopping. Use the panic button on the car key pad if caught in a situation or to keep a finger on it when walking to the car. He was great!

A few highlights I remember from his class:

- **IF YOU SEE SOMETHING SUSPICIOUS - CALL 911.** Those of us from the North Country are very hesitant to use 911 for anything other than reporting a crime in progress. First Sgt. Tolley made it quite clear that calling 911 is the way to go in Brunswick County if you need to report suspicious activity in addition to a crime in progress.
- The Sheriff's Department sponsors a **VOLUNTEER CITIZEN PATROL.** You can get additional information about it at the substation located at the intersection of Country Club and Rt. 179.
- First Sgt. Tolley mentioned that, if there is enough interest, he would be willing to offer a class in **SELF DEFENSE FOR WOMEN.**

The Board has continued to encourage community involvement at all our board meetings. Some of the ways we have done this is by scheduling resident comment periods at both the beginning AND the end of every meeting, posting our minutes on our website and posting our agenda on the club house bulletin boards prior to our meetings. It worked! Residents attended some of our board meetings. I'll be the first to admit that most of the business we conduct is mundane and on behalf of the Board I thank you for being patient with us as we wade through the routine business of our POA. In order to make it more comfortable for you the Board decided to schedule our meetings at a time when the large room is not in use by another group. 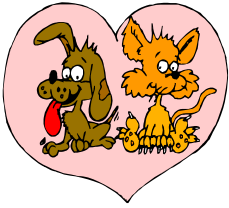
