Smoking rules for the POA's Recreation Areas are as follows:

There is no smoking permitted in the pool area enclosed by the fence. Smoking is only permitted in the area outside of the fence. Under North Carolina law vaping is considered smoking.

There is no smoking permitted on the tennis courts or the pickleball courts. Smoking is only permitted outside the fenced area of the courts.

There is no smoking permitted under the roof of the pavilion. A designated smoking area has been established 25 feet from the pavilion.

This year, the POA Holiday Party will be held at the Elks Lodge, 2679 Carter Drive, in Calabash.

Due to the occupancy capacity of the Elks, two separate parties will be held – Friday, December 8 and Saturday, December 9. The time for each party is from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Happy Hour is from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. and a plated dinner will be served at 6:00 p.m. Seating is limited to 130 people for each date. The cost is \$10.00

per person for residents. Guest tickets are \$20.00 and are limited to one per household with at least one resident attending.

Tickets will be sold on a first come, first served basis. Each resident must come in person to pick up their own ticket or tickets for their household or guest. In order to accommodate our numbers, tables will be set for parties of 8.
